Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission Sam College of Ayurvedic Sciences and Hospital, Village-Agariya Chopra, P/O.- Kharwai, Block-Saanchi, Tehsil Raisen-464551, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0485) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 3rd renewal of permission for increase in intake capacity from 60 Seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sam College of Ayurvedic Sciences and Hospital, Village-Agariya Chopra, P/O.- Kharwai, Block-Saanchi, Tehsil Raisen-464551, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0485)** inspection was conducted on **08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 via Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **Annual visitation for issuance of Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 3rd renewal of permission for increase in intake capacity from 60 Seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

1. Teaching staffs:-

- a) **Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college**
$$\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{44}{45} \times 100\% = 97.77\% \text{ (Excluding Excess)}$$
- b) **There is shortcoming of 01 professor in Kaumarbhritya Department.**

2. Functionality of the hospital:-

- a) **There were 00 deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2024 to 31st Dec 2024. Labour room is functional.**

- 3) The assessment report was duly placed in the **133rd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 11.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue the yearly permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and 3rd renewal of permission for increase in intake capacity from 60 Seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**

"DECISION"

- 4) **Therefore, Sam College of Ayurvedic Sciences and Hospital, Village-Agariya Chopra, P/O.- Kharwai, Block-Saanchi, Tehsil Raisen-464551, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0485) is hereby granted with yearly permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 3rd Renewal of permission for increase in intake capacity from 60 seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings along with following requirements shall be fulfilled: -**

- I. Minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective

counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 5) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 6) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 7) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8) **The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for the Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The shortcomings mentioned in above Para no. 2, shall be fulfilled.
 - Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.**
- 9) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
